The Act 230 Medical Marijuana Legislative Oversight Working Group (“Act 230 Working Group”) was established by the Legislature pursuant to HB2707 CD1 (2016), Act 230, to develop and recommend legislation to improve the medical marijuana dispensary system in the State to ensure safe and legal access to medical marijuana for qualifying patients.

The Act 230 Working Group is tasked with addressing issues related to the medical marijuana dispensary program in the State, including operations, edibles, and any issues the Working Group finds relevant to the medical marijuana dispensary program. Act 230 requests the Working Group to submit an interim report of its findings and recommendations to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2017, and a final report of the working group’s findings and recommendations to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2018.
